The king with a holy zeal wanted to build a church with very expensive wood. He did in fact cut a huge tree and made it the primary column in the church. Since it was so huge, not even a group of men could move this column. St. Nino prayed in her room, that God may help them and so that the king may not be sad in trying to build the first church. How amazing it was to everyone; the next morning light shone from the column and it moved on its own to its assigned spot without anyone touching it.

With great ease the church was completed. The people and the king wanted to receive the Holy Sacrament of Baptism and the Lord granted them their wish.

St. Nino did not stay long in the monastery; for the Lord permitted her to become ill for a short while. She then departed on the 17th day of Toot (1st Coptic month) when the Feast of the Holy Cross is also celebrated.





Rufinus has told this story based on what he had heard from a Spanish prince by the name of Bakur; whom he met in Palestine before the beginning of the 5th century. This story was then translated to Greek, Syrian, Armenian, Coptic, Arabic and Ethiopian.

After St. Nino had won thousands of souls and offered to them the love of Christ; she returned to Georgia where she rested in the Lord in the year 338 AD

After she departed; a church was built next to her burial where many Christians go to visit.

When the king and the queen rested also in the Lord, their son became king and the Lord healed him with St. Nino's prayers and he also was a witness to his Savior and attracted many to the faith.
