WHAT IS EVIL

- All beings are either Creator or creatures created by the Creator
- Everything God created is good (Genesis 1:31)
- Evil is not a thing but a wrong choice
- No more positive than darkness
- Just as real, is not an illusion

- Spiritual and physical sin are linked

- When we rebel against God, the human soul loses its life and joy
- The Body and the soul suffer together

- Who's to say we are good people?
 - "Why do good things happen to bad people?"
 - Not why the glass of water is half empty but why it is half full
 - All goodness is gift
 - The best man who ever lived once said,
 "No one is good but God alone."

- Who's to say suffering is all bad?
 - In His infinite wisdom, He determined the greater good could not have come about without the existence of evil.
 - Our Lord would not have shown His sacrificial love on the cross unless there was something to sacrifice for.
 - Certain virtues couldn't exist without evil

God is all-loving, allgood, all-wise, all-just, all-powerful

 Who's to say suffering is all bad? Even in a severe trial God is working all things together for the good of those who love Him (Rom 8:28).

- Who's to say we have to know all God's reasons?
 - Those things which appear evil only appear that way because of a limited context or perspective.
 - Book of Job

- Who's to say we have to know all God's reasons?
 - A child on the tenth story of a burning building cannot see the firefighters with their safety net on the street. They call up, "Jump! We'll catch you. Trust us." The child objects, "But I can't see you." The firefighter replies, "That's all right. I can see you. We are like that child, evil is like the fire, our ignorance is like the smoke, God is like the firefighter, and Christ is like the safety net.

- God's omnipotence does not mean He has the power to bring about logical contradictions.
 - He could not create a round square or
 - God cannot "lie" (Titus 1:2)

FREE WILL AND PREDESTINATION



- "For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son" (Rom 8:29)
- We were chosen, for He KNEW us before we were created that we would believe in Him.
- God isn't pre or post He is present to everything
- If God is love we must have free will
- Omnipotence wants human acts done freely
